Ukraine, Euro-Crises and Syria – to name but a few – shaped the political land-scape of a year of crises in 2015. International Relations were at the center of public attention, and will be for the years to come. IFAIR is proud to have taken part in some of the large foreign policy debates during the past year. In IFAIR's fifth year since its foundation, we realized more projects than ever before and were able to continuously increase our professionality. Your enormous interest and participation was a strong testimony to our main goal: To let the young generation participate in the world of foreign affairs. We would like to thank everyone that supported us during the last year and made our work possible.

Our Highlights 2015

- Number of members increased by 26 % to a total of 121.
- 3.650 people follow our activities on Facebook (in a brand-new design).
- Our Open Think Tank grew to 350 submissions and was visited 49.003 times.
- <u>EU-ASEAN Perspectives</u> has established itself successfully as a cornerstone
 of EU-ASEAN relations and presented its final report in June in Brussels to representatives of the EU and ASEAN member embassies.
- The <u>Trilateral Peace Talks Germany, Russia, Ukraine</u> in May were a beacon
 of understanding in the midst of the Ukraine-crisis.
- 15 of our members talked to former Undersecretary of State Dr. Born at our <u>camp-side-talk</u> about careers in foreign affairs and current events.
- Our <u>Core Team</u> grew by four competent and dynamic new members: Hanna Elten, Ravenna Sohst, Johannes Klein and Florian Winkler.
- With donations and project funding of over 9.000,- EUR, multiple non-monetary donations, voluntary work and two strategy meetings (Berlin and Munich) in 2015, IFAIR has reached a new level of professionality as an organization.

Impact Group: "EU-ASEAN Perspectives" - Part 2

Project Partners: European Institute for Asian Studies, EU Centre in Singapore, Hanns Seidel Foundation.

In March, 20 students and young professionals from South East Asia and Europe met online for a workshop to discuss current issues of EU-ASEAN relations. This lead to a policy paper which a core



delegation presented to representatives from politics, diplomacy, science and civil society during a delegation trip to Brussels in June. Impact Group: "Trilateral Peace Talks"

Project Partners: Friedrich Ebert Foundation, Hertie Foundation, Foundation West-Eastern Encounters

In May, IFAIR brought 30 young academics and actors from civil society from Germany, Russia and the Ukraine together in Berlin for the "Trilateral Peace Talks". The four-day event aimed at an intense exchange between the participants. Topics were the current crises



in Ukraine, but particularly trying to work on common ground regarding origins, media coverage and possible solutions for the crisis. Impact Group: "Arms Trade"

experts – among others – from the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) and the Bonn International Center for Conversion (BICC). EU-ASEAN - Part III

In the third edition of our successful format for dialogue "EU-ASEAN Perspectives", participants from all over Europe and South East Asia will shed light on the topic of migration from different points of view. In summer, a delegation visit to South East Asia is planned for the first time.

UN Parliament

The Impact Group "UN Parliament" organizes a simulation for students under the title *Model UN Parliamentary Assembly Preparatory Committee* as well as a scientific symposium dealing with *Democratization of World Politics or Continuation of Hegemonic Structures? The Idea of a World Parliament.*

LACalytics

The Impact Group "LACalytics" initiates an interregional program that connects young experts and students from Latin America, the Caribbean and the European Union through a commonly written and published policy paper. In October 2016 the results will be presented to and discussed with the public at a closing conference.

German-Russian Student Exchange: A Culture of Remembrance

Under the slogan "Memory as a Tool of Change: Lessons learned from Germany", IFAIR invites a group of Russian students to Berlin to discuss with their German exchange partners about remembrance and responsibility regarding totalitarian regimes of the 20th century.
